

Children learn about the importance of water. They discover water is used far many everyday things. They can recognise differences between themselves and water dwellers. We look at plastic sea creatures and explore ways in which they have adapted to their watery environment. Children have the opportunity to move like aquatic animals in the fantastic "Rockpool Races" fi nale.



Two New Arrivals - Curviers Dwarf Caiman

Despite their diminutive sounding name the Cuvier's dwarf caiman are both around 1.5 metres in length and have to be handled with extreme caution.

Blue Planet Aquarium herpetologist Joe Chattell said: "The Cuvier's dwarf caiman is actually the smallest surviving member of the crocodilian family in the Americas.

"They are found throughout South America and live in freshwater habitats like rivers, including the Amazon, flooded forests and larger lakes.

"In the wild their diet includes fish, reptiles, amphibians, birds and small mammals," he added.

The caimans are covered with extremely tough, bony armour plates. This may be to make up for their relatively small size and protect them from attacks by larger predators.

Among other unusual characteristics are the facts that, unlike most crocodilians, they do not have webbed feet and they also have brown, as opposed to the more common, yellow eyes.
