# ROYAL ARMOURIES



The Royal Armouries tells real stories about the ways in which arms and armour have affected and continue to affect our communities.

We cater for all forms of learning, from early years to lifelong learners, formal education to independent research.

If you are planning a group visit to the Royal Armouries then select the appropriate site from the menu on the web site and get all the information you need to make your visit a productive and memorable one. Of course you can explore the rest of the web site too and learn even more interesting facts about arms and armour as well as related subjects.

The Royal Armouries Museum currently displays over 8500 objects that tell real stories about the ways in which arms and armour have been used by our armed services.

These real stories are told in different ways: from an interpretator in role recounting how Henry Tudor's army defeated the forces of Richard III in 1485 at the Battle of Bosworth to displays of modern warfare artifacts including a suite of medals granted to a young Leeds soldier during WWI.

To give your visit extra depth why not book a session held in the education centre. This will give your group the opportunity to get to grips with the kit, ephemera, weapons and armour of soldiers from previous generations. Sessions can focus upon topics such as: the qualities of leadership, battlefield tactics or the experiences of soldiers during battles such as Towton, Waterloo or the Somme. Sessions can be tailor made to fit your requirements.
